This includes paper, CDs, disks, and credit cards only. This event is for individuals only (no businesses) and will take place in the downtown parking area beginning at 9:00AM until 12:00 noon. Pembroke Advanced Communications will also be joining the effort by offering a bin that day at the same location for computers and electronics to be disposed of and destroyed properly. Please remember that the City does not pick up electronics! Non-hazardous items and yard debris such as large limbs may be arranged for pick up by calling City Hall. There is a fee for this service. April's highlight citizen: Mr. James Garrison



James Garrison moved to Pembroke from Willie, GA at a very young age. As a child, he gained valuable experience assisting his father with the cotton and tobacco as well as the livestock. By the time he was a young man, Mr. Garrison was responsible for overseeing the crops on the farm.

Through the years, Mr. Garrison's father acquired a large tract of land where a meal factory was constructed. James oversaw the factory where residents living in and around Pembroke brought their corn to be ground into grits and cornmeal. Mr. Garrison graduated from Pembroke High School and then attended Savannah State College where he learned skills to become a brick mason. He became an entrepreneur, laying foundations for houses being built in the community. He would later teach these skills to others, enabling them to build and expand Pembroke.

Mr. Garrison attends Mount Moriah Baptist Church where he has been a strong religious leader. He has also served as Chair of Planning & Zoning for the city during the 1970's. Mr. Garrison is considered by many to be a pillar of the community and is thought of with great esteem. During a time when jobs were scarce, he provided jobs in cotton and tobacco. He taught brick masonry skills, shared the crops he grew and has never been afraid to speak out on issues to improve the quality of life in our community.
