Our Citizens Remembered A letter from Mayor Cook

Since our last newsletter, the City of Pembroke has lost some of our oldest and dearest friends Mrs. Frieda Bacon and Mr. and Mrs. Bob Quattlebaum.

Mrs. Frieda Bacon was a longtime cornerstone of Pembroke's business community. Through her many jobs, she always remained a supporter of her town. As members of the Pembroke Christian Church, she and her husband, Mr. Harold Bacon, led the North Bryan Ministerial Association which attended to needs ranging from empty pockets and pantries to flat tires and leaky roofs.

Mr. Bob and Mrs. Virginia Quattlebaum were some of Pembroke's most devoted civic leaders. Mr. Bob served as a volunteer firefighter and Mrs. Virginia as an EMT. Both were leaders in First Baptist Church. They began Pembroke's long tradition of placing American flags downtown in memory of deceased veterans. For this work, they recently had a street named in their honor and will be recognized by the American Legion with crosses and flags on Veterans' Day, Nov. 19.

Our thoughts and prayers go out to both their families in their time of loss and thank them for allowing us to be part of their lives.

A Look Back 100 Years

A record-breaking ginning season began on August 15, 1917 when Pembroke farmer Mr. George Edwards brought in a 421-pound bale of cotton to the Sims Brothers Ginnery. After ginning, the cotton was sold for 25 cents per pound to Mr. Louis Perlmutt, a Pembroke store owner and cotton broker. The final tally for all of Bryan County that year was 3,491 bales with a value of \$150,000. In those days, the mules, wagons, plows, seed and fertilizer was bought; the cotton was insured, weighed, ginned and sold; and the money spent on groceries, clothing, lumber and supplies for the next crop all in Pembroke! 100 years later, how far has progress taken us?
