Safe Walking Tips

- Walk on the sidewalk.
- Cross at intersections and use the crosswalk.
- Look left, right, and left again before crossing.
- Walk facing traffic, if there are no sidewalks.
- Wear bright colors and reflective gear.
- Make eye contact with drivers.
- Pay attention to your surroundings. Walk with a trusted adult and / or with friends.

Five steps to crossing the street safely



Step 1: Cross with an adult.



Step 2: Cross at a safe place such as an intersection.



Step 3: Stop before going into the road.



Step 4: Look both ways and listen for traffic.



Step 5: Cross quickly and safely.

Be especially careful in bad weather.

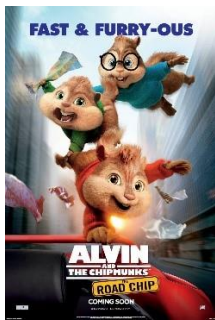
“New Pool Hours”

IT'S HURRICANE SEASON IN GEORGIA

Since we live in coastal Georgia, you should be prepared in the event a hurricane threatens our coast. Even though our city is far enough away from the coast to be safe from storm surge, we are susceptible to the hurricane winds, tornadoes and some local flooding. For your safety and that of your family and your pets, you must adhere to emergency officials and evacuate when ordered to do so. The key to being ready for a hurricane is simple: Be prepared, have a plan, and stay informed. Know when you should leave, where you should go, how you will get there, and what you should take with you.
