

TREE CITY USA ARBOR DAY IN PEMBROKE

In celebration of Arbor Day, the City of Pembroke will be conducting a tree planting ceremony in the City Municipal Park adjacent to the Harn Community Center on Friday, February 19th at 10:00 AM. Each year the State of Georgia designates the third Friday of February as the official day to observe Arbor Day throughout the state. Trees reduce erosion, lower our heating and cooling costs, clean the air, provide habitat for wildlife, increase property values, and beautify our community. The tree selected to be planted was chosen to provide shade for the playground area of the park. 2016 marks the 12th year that the City of Pembroke has been designated as a Tree City USA. Join us for the official tree planting ceremony followed with light refreshments as we celebrate Arbor Day in Pembroke.

GARBAGE CAN SAFETY REMINDER

Please continue to have garbage cans placed at curbside by 7:00 AM on Wednesday for pick-up. Also make sure that cans are removed from the curbside on the same day, preferably before dark. The cans remaining on the curbside are particularly dangerous for drivers after dark since the cans do not have any reflective areas. They can also block a driver's vision of children, pets, or vehicles that may be on the roadside.
