75 Years Ago



After much discussion at a Council meeting in 1943, the City voted to borrow \$3,300 to purchase Pembroke's first Firetruck. At the same meeting, the motion was carried for the Police Dept to rent a horse from Mr. T.L. Waters for 30 days for \$20, and if the horse proved satisfactory, to retain him for regular patrol. The following minutes do not mention whether or not the horse

worked out, but the fire truck served the City well into the 1980's. If anyone out there has any pictures of either department from this period please share them with us.
