




Pembroke Remembers Patriot's Day

Hurricane Preparations



The City is preparing. Are you? It's now the peak of hurricane season and the time to review your safety plan is now. Please keep a supply of things you will need in case of an emergency: bottled water, canned food, flashlights and batteries, etc. Have a contact and a plan if you ever need to evacuate the area.

Check around your home for loose debris, hanging limbs and anything that could prevent stormwater from reaching a drainage point. Check the home itself for loose siding or shingles, cracked windows or anything that could break loose in bad weather and cause damage. Finally, contact your insurance company and make sure your flood insurance and homeowner's policy are up to date.

If you have any concerns or questions, please contact City Hall. We have brochures and checklists to keep in your emergency kit, as well as maps showing low lying and flood-prone areas. We'll also keep you up-to-date in the event of a storm.
